## 2007 Journals Pricing Now Available

Blackwell Publishing's 2007 Journals Price List is now available on our website here: [www.blackwellpublishing.com/cservices/pricelist.pdf](http://www.blackwellpublishing.com/cservices/pricelist.pdf)

All institutional subscriptions to Blackwell Publishing journals include an element of online access. For the first time in 2007, Standard print subscriptions will include online access to the current and two previous years' content, increased from the one year previously offered. Premium subscriptions include print plus online access to current content, content dating back to January 1st 1997, and OnlineEarly articles published online before print. Online-Only subscriptions include the same access rights as Premium. Both Premium and Online-Only subscriptions include archival rights to paid-for content. In most cases, Standard subscriptions are at 90% of the Premium price and Online-Only subscriptions are at 85% of the Premium price.

We also offer a range of journal Collections which enable libraries to provide their patrons with access to hundreds more journals for a fraction of the full subscription cost. Blackwell Collections have high usage,

providing excellent value for money. They enable researchers easily to click through to the full text of articles they have identified through A&I databases and search engines, regardless of whether the library has historically subscribed to a particular journal, and support increasing multi-disciplinary research. Blackwell's Collection licensing terms also provide access to additional journals not just for the period of the license, but full archival rights to the licensed volumes, where Blackwell has society consents to grant such rights.

We plan to make the complete backfiles of up to 500 scholarly journals available online by the end of 2008. The program will cover all disciplines and is expected to comprise 6.5 million pages in total. It encompasses all issues of each journal from Volume 1, Issue 1 to December 1996.

Reduced rates are offered on all large orders or consortia purchases.

## Notice for IngentaConnect Customers

As of January 1st 2007, the full text of articles in Blackwell Publishing journals will no longer be hosted on IngentaConnect. Libraries wishing to continue to provide online access to these journals should activate their access on *Blackwell Synergy* [www.blackwell-synergy.com](http://www.blackwell-synergy.com).

IngentaConnect will continue to host the metadata for Blackwell Publishing journals (including the tables of contents and abstracts) but users wishing to access the full text (in PDF or HTML format) will be directed to *Blackwell Synergy* where their access rights will be validated. Users whose access is not validated by *Blackwell Synergy* will be offered the option to buy 'pay per view' access on IngentaConnect.

Philippa Scoones, Web Publishing Director at Blackwell Publishing, described the move as an extension of the partnership between Ingenta and Blackwell. "We have worked closely with Ingenta for almost ten years and they have successfully provided access to our journals online to a good number of library customers. As we develop our own online journals platform, *Blackwell Synergy*, to be the primary source for searching and

linking to Blackwell content, we want to be sure that all our customers benefit by providing the full text on Synergy".

# Blackwell Synergy

The following new features aimed at improving the researcher experience have been added to *Blackwell Synergy* in recent months:

- **Compatibility with RefWorks**  
This online bibliographic management tool has been added to the list of compatible services.
- **Top 20 Most Read Articles (by journal)**  
A link on each journal's List of Issues and Table of Contents page takes the user to a list of the journal's top 20 most read (downloaded) articles in *Blackwell Synergy* in the previous rolling 12 months.
- **Top 20 Most Cited Articles (by journal)**  
A link on each journal's List of Issues and Table of Contents page takes the user to a list of the journal's top 20 most cited articles in the previous rolling 36 months.

- **OnlineEarly eTOC alerts**  
Users signed up for email table of content (eTOC) alerts will automatically get the journal's OnlineEarly alerts on a weekly basis. Users can change this daily or monthly alerts. OnlineEarly is where articles are published online ahead of the print edition.
- **Expanded list of publication dates on full text HTML pages**  
For articles published going forward, dates shown will now include "Accepted Article Online" (when relevant), "Published Article Online" (when relevant) and "Issue Published Online".

*Blackwell Synergy* will be relaunched at the end of 2006 with an exciting new look designed to improve the speed and navigation on the site. More information will follow.

## Blackwell Sponsors Young Chinese Librarian



Blackwell has established an academic scholarship for a young librarian from the Chinese Academic Library & Information System (CALIS) to attend the International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA) conference held in Seoul, Korea in August. The scholarship included funds to travel to

Seoul and to attend the full program of meetings and events.

After stiff competition for the scholarship, Ms. Liu Xia, Assistant Director at the Wuhan University Library, was named the winning librarian. With a solid background in reference work and research, Ms. Liu heads the Information Services Centre at the Wuhan University Library, and has published several papers addressing issues of selection and evaluation of databases.

"I am excited to learn more from the experts of worldwide libraries", said Ms. Liu. "I believe that I can do it and bring the new knowledge back to China."

The sponsorship of the Young Chinese Librarian follows Blackwell's recent announcement of its 100th Asian journal and is part of our ongoing commitment to the region.

## HSS Journals to Benefit from Upgrade to Full Text HTML



During the latter part of 2006, we will be upgrading the online versions of a further 130 journals in our Humanities and Social Science list to have the full text HTML capabilities of *Blackwell Synergy*. This will mean that almost all Blackwell titles will be available in full text HTML, as well as PDF, as of the first issues of 2007.

Full text HTML allows much deeper searching online, which in turn makes it more likely for researchers to find relevant research articles. References are available for online browsing and all tables and graphics can be expanded for easy viewing. Increasingly researchers read part or all of their articles on screen in HTML, before accessing the PDF for archiving or printing.

## The Future of Developing World Access to Journals Now Secured

Representatives from several publishers, including Blackwell, met with representatives from the FAO, WHO and UNEP, Yale and Cornell Libraries and other partner organizations at the National Academy of Sciences in Washington for the annual HINARI-AGORA-OARE Partners meeting on July 20th 2006. A major theme of the meeting was to consider the results of two specially commissioned independent reviews of the current status of the HINARI and AGORA programs, five years after the launch of the first program, and to decide upon their longer term future.

We are delighted to report that the partners accepted the recommendation of both Reviews that HINARI, AGORA and the soon to be launched OARE program should be continued at least to meet the time scale of the United Nations' Millennium Development Goals. This means that the partners, under the present terms of participation, have made a commitment to continue and develop the programs at least until 2015. In this, they will seek increased participation from users, librarians and information specialists in the beneficiary countries.

The Reviews, funded largely with a grant from the UK's Department for International Development, looked at user feedback, publisher experiences, training and infrastructure issues, five years after HINARI first launched. The reviews were conducted by John Scott (Center for Public Service Communication, Arlington, USA) and Mark Ware (Mark Ware Consulting Ltd, Bristol, UK). Other recommendations which came

from the Reviews, and which we will be following up on, included the need for improved authentication processes which would make it easier for users to access the 3,600+ journals from almost 100 international publishers in the HINARI and AGORA catalogues, the need for increased training and promotion, and a more formal organization structure.

### Key Decisions of the Partners Meeting:

- The Partners accepted the recommendations of the Usage and Infrastructure (Partners) Reviews.
- HINARI-AGORA-OARE will continue and will be linked to the time scale of the UN's Millennium Development Goals, with a review date of 2015.
- Guidelines for publishers to participate in HINARI-AGORA-OARE will continue as present.
- The partners will develop a long term Strategic Plan.
- AGORA Phase 2 (access for countries with a GNP between \$1001 and \$3000) will launch in September 2006.
- It is planned that OARE (Online Access to Research in the Environment) will be launched in October 2006.
- The partners will continue to seek support funds for training, outreach and other program related activities.
- Access will continue to be free to more than 2,100 institutions in 69 of the least developed countries
- The publishers will continue to remit all access fees (\$1000 per institution) from 44 "Phase 2" countries to WHO and FAO for training and outreach in order to increase usage of the programs.

## Boston hosts Blackwell's Library Advisory Board



In June, Blackwell held its sixth Library Advisory Board meeting in Boston, MA. The Library Advisory Board came into being in 2003 and is now held twice a year, usually once in North America and once in Europe. The Boston meeting was, as always, conducted in a spirit of open and frank discussion and was enjoyable for all those who attended. The meeting produced 35 pages of detailed notes from the discussions and a host of recommendations for our publishing and ideas for further consideration.

As well as covering the traditional subjects of pricing models for journal collections, Synergy developments and licensing issues, the meeting had a strong editorial focus with presentations from Blackwell's Boston staff on the process of journals publishing, why journals move between publishers and how best to launch new products.

Another session, for which we were joined by officers of four US societies, including the New York Academy of Sciences and

the American Meteorological Society, focussed on the future of the journal in an electronic environment and funding issues for societies and libraries. It made a small but valuable contribution to a better mutual understanding of the challenges that face both scholarly societies and libraries. There was universal agreement that we should bring society officers and librarians together more regularly in the future.

Blackwell's Library Advisory Board is a great example of how we are building stronger relationships with our customers. We use it to discuss difficult issues and have an honest exchange of views on them, and more often than not we find some better way of dealing with them. The Boston meeting might also be seen as a great example of what Blackwell is all about: mediating in an expert way between one branch of scholarship – the societies – and another – the research libraries.

## Results of the Survey of Library News Readers



In May 2006, we undertook a broad ranging survey of the readers of our librarians' newsletter to gather views on a range of key issues, including the move to e-only; 'big deals'; and e-books. Many thanks to those of you who took part in this. The information we gathered is extremely valuable for helping us to keep in tune with the constantly evolving journals marketplace and to help us to continue to develop our understanding of the needs and expectations of libraries.

In total 925 librarians completed the survey, representing a 6.1% response rate. 26% of

respondents came from mainland Europe, with 22% from the USA and 12% from the UK. 78% of the respondents were based at university libraries and the majority of those (29%) had between 1000 and 5000 full-time equivalent staff and students (FTE).

Regarding the move to e-only, as many as 66% of librarians said that their library was planning to move its entire journals collection online only. Of these, 49% said that it would happen in the next two years, with a further 43.5% expecting it to happen within the next 5 years. The benefits of moving to e-only were identified as researchers' preference (41.8%), saving space (23.4%), and convenience (22.7%). Most librarians do not perceive e-only journals to have lower cost implications or less administrative work for them to carry out. In fact, many of them said administration would increase with e-only.

When questioned about the obstacles of moving their journals collections to e-only, the majority (72.3%) cited archival access as the main obstacle. As reported in previous issues of this newsletter, Blackwell is participating in several different archiving initiatives and will continue to support a diverse approach to archiving.

Another hot topic we wanted to address in our survey was the question of the 'Big Deal'. The factors which librarians said were very important in influencing their decision to purchase the Big Deal Collection of journals from Blackwell Publishing were: budget availability, perceived value for money, subject coverage and usage.

For those who have not purchased a Big Deal package from Blackwell, the survey uncovered what we largely expected; that the main reason for not purchasing was as a consequence of budget availability, or rather lack of it (52.6% cited budget restrictions). In addition, 15.8% of those who have not bought the Collection said that it was because of the inability to cancel print subscriptions, inherent to the deal.
