

Applications are invited for the position of North American editor of

Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia

Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia is published by Wiley-Blackwell on behalf of the Association of Veterinary Anaesthetists and the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiologists. Its purpose is the publication of original, peer-reviewed articles covering all branches of anaesthesia and the relief of pain in animals.

Published bi-monthly, the Journal is abstracted by the leading international databases, including Medline. It is also indexed by Thomson Reuters (ISI) and in 2010 achieved an impact factor of 1.29 and is ranked 41st out of 145 journals in the veterinary sciences subject category.

The successful candidate will be US-based and have extensive experience in research and publishing in academic journals. The four main functions within this role are: Strategic Management, Editorial Team Management, Manuscript Management and Journal Promotion. The post involves working closely with the co-editor, editorial board and the publisher.

The ideal person must possess the following skills:

- ❖ PhD OR 10 years research experience with good track record of academic publications
- ❖ Excellent written and verbal communication
- ❖ Sound scientific judgement
- ❖ Leadership qualities
- ❖ Excellent knowledge of research frontiers in veterinary anaesthesia (internationally)
- ❖ Ability to work to tight deadlines.
- ❖ Commercial awareness (marketing and advertising)

The ideal candidate will be recognised internationally for his or her academic publications, and have an impressive track record of academic output. Applicants should note that this position requires a number of hours work each week with the possibility of additional days required for meetings and conferences. In light of this a modest honorarium is granted.

The current editor is intending to step down in 2012, so with a subsequent handover period, the new editor would be in place by 1st July 2012.

Applications should include a curriculum vitae, a short assessment of the strengths and weaknesses of *Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia* nationally and internationally, and an outline of your vision for the Journal and how you would like to see it develop in the future.
