# **Grass and Forage Science**

*Grass and Forage Science* is an international journal that publishes high quality papers on all aspects of grassland and rangeland management. It reports the results of research and development in grass and forage production, and in its management and utilization, taking an integrated view of grassland and related systems. It also publishes results on the environmental implications of grassland and rangeland systems and dealing with amenity and recreational uses of grasslands. Papers are considered irrespective of climatic zone. Reviews are also considered in these areas. Papers which relate to inter-disciplinary research, modelling and other non-classical experimental approaches, as well as classical experimental approaches, are particularly welcomed.

*Grass and Forage Science* is the official journal of the British Grassland Society and the European Grassland Federation and is published by Wiley-Blackwell. It has an Impact Factor of 1.035 and an increasing readership.

Applicants are sought for two Co-Editors to replace Professor John Milne who is retiring as Editor in December 2009. The four main functions within this role are: strategic management; Editorial Team management; manuscript management; and journal promotion. The posts involve working closely with the Boards of Associate and Advisory Editors, the sponsors of the journal and the Publisher.

The ideal person must possess the following attributes:

- ❖ PhD and at least 10 years' research experience with an outstanding record of academic publications
- ❖ Excellent written communication skills
- ❖ Prior knowledge of or experience in editing, thus having familiarity of working with a range of authors and to tight deadlines
- ❖ Sound scientific judgement
- ❖ Experience across a range of areas of the remit of the journal in an international context
- ❖ Management experience

Applicants should note that these positions, which are from 1 January 2010, require an input of one day per week and an honorarium commensurate with the effort is offered.
