**Workshop on Analytic Writing  
for Jungian Analysts and Candidates  
28<sup>th</sup> May 2009, 09.00 to 16.30**

Although most of us have taken college-level composition courses and many of us have written theses in graduate school or reading-in papers during analytic training, we often find ourselves at a loss when we attempt to write a paper for an analytic audience. When the publication to which we have submitted the paper returns it with a letter suggesting a number of alterations or, worse, rejecting it altogether, we are ashamed and discouraged and, unless we find a sympathetic mentor, this has led more than a few of us to abandon analytic writing altogether.

In recent years analytic institutes have become cognizant of this problem and tried to correct it. Training programmes have realized that not only do writing classes foster the skills of potential writers but they also sharpen the critical thinking of candidates, helping them to reflect more deeply on their ideas as well as their clinical work. As a result, many analytic institutes and societies have begun to offer writing classes and workshops, and more papers and theses are being required prior to graduation.

The faculty for this workshop includes a group of experienced writers and editors consisting of John Beebe (first U.S. editor of the JAP), Michael Horne (current U.S. editor of the JAP), Jean Kirsch (co-coordinator of the first writing class at the C.G. Jung Institute of San Francisco) and Joy Schaverien (longtime teacher of writing to students in academic psychotherapy programmes and a U.K. assistant editor of the JAP).

The workshop is scheduled for the 28<sup>th</sup> May 2009, the day before the JAP conference so that attendees can attend both events. It is restricted to certified analysts and analytic candidates, and attendance will be limited to 16 participants. Each will be asked to bring a 500 word introduction to a paper in progress or one that they would like to write. There will be two large group sessions of formal teaching and discussion and two four-person group sessions in which the work of each individual participant will be closely studied. A box lunch and morning and afternoon refreshments will be provided on site.
