

Physiologia Plantarum

Author submission checklist

This checklist is intended as a guide for authors to ensure that you have assembled all the necessary information for submitting your manuscript and that your manuscript is correctly formatted. Please read the detailed Author Guidelines before you begin the submission process.

General information

- Have you prepared your cover letter? Does it highlight the key questions addressed by your research? Does it highlight the novelty of your key findings? Does it provide a sound biological reason for your choice of experimental species?
- Have you read the exclusive licence agreement and are you able to sign it on behalf of all authors? Note that manuscripts submitted to Physiologia Plantarum are reviewed on the understanding that they have neither been published, nor are under consideration for publication, elsewhere.
- Have all persons entitled to authorship been named and have they all approved the final version of the submitted manuscript?
- Have you identified four potential reviewers and can you provide their email addresses?
- Does your manuscript have colour figures? If so, are you prepared to pay the additional cost? Have you considered greyscale versions of the figures?
- Is this manuscript a resubmission? If so, do you have the previous manuscript number and have you prepared the point-by-point response letter as requested by the Editor? Note that resubmissions must be done via the “create a resubmis-

sion” option in your ScholarOne Manuscripts Author Center.

Manuscript preparation

- Is your manuscript prepared according to Physiologia Plantarum style as set out in the Author Guidelines?
- Is the text 1.5-spaced and are the pages numbered?
- For research papers the Abstract must not exceed 250 words in length. Does it clearly state the problem being addressed, the methods employed, the main results and does it contain your main conclusion?
- Have you checked your manuscript for length? Physiologia Plantarum publishes only the first six printed pages free of charge (one printed page of full text is equivalent to 5600 characters, including spaces). Have you considered whether your manuscript could be condensed?
- Are the references and in-text citations formatted according to the journal style?
- Are the tables self-explanatory and each presented on a separate page outside the text, but as part of the same document?
- Have you prepared the original figures in digital form and at high enough resolution? Consult the Artwork Guidelines for detailed instructions on how to prepare your figures.
- Have you completed the submission process? Submission is complete when you are provided with a Successful Submission Confirmation that includes your manuscript number.
