

References must conform to the Harvard style, as described in the Instructions for Authors on the inside back cover of the *IJDT*. Alternatively, go to www.sdt.org and click on Publications. Also, see example below.

General:

Do not use a number for each citation, either in the text or in the References section.

In the text:

1. Do not use commas **anywhere** in a citation in the text:

- (Pinnock 2006) is correct, not (Pinnock, 2006)

2. Note that *et al.* must be in italics, without a comma:

- *et al.* is required, not *et al.*, or *et al*,

3. Do not use '&' with 2 authors, but use 'and':

- Pinnock & Smith is incorrect; Pinnock and Smith is correct

In the References section:

4. Citations should be listed in alphabetical order of first author.

5. A comma should not appear after the author's surname nor a full stop after their initials; and the surname must precede the author's initials - you have a mixture in many citations, with the author initials both before and after the surname.

6. The year must be in parentheses, and there should not be a full stop after the year.

7. The journal title must be in italics, and the volume number must be in bold, without a part number and without a colon.

8. Finally, give the full title of the journal and do not use abbreviations.

Incorrect:

IJDT requires:

Kucukoner E and Haque Z U (1998) Peptide profile of low fat Edam cheese. *Turkish Journal of Veterinary and Animal Sciences* **22** 449-452.
